State of the Project

2021 was a difficult year worldwide due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the Mediterranean region was no exception.

Skills4Sports moved most of its activities online throughout the year or, wherever possible, held smaller events, observing all COVID-19 preventive measures. The pandemic situation started improving towards the end of the year allowing for the opening conference to go ahead in Malta in December of 2021.

Gradually, in the new year, more in-person events started being organised. Over the course of the first half of 2022, memorandums of agreement were signed with stakeholders in Palestine and Infodays were organised in Malta, Spain, and Italy, increasing the number of stakeholders committed to Skills4Sports and of young NEETs interested and informed about the project.

2022 also saw the publication of the country situation analysis reports and the synthesis of the cross-border analysis report, which offer information and insights regarding unemployment in the six Mediterranean countries where the project is being carried out.

Opening Conference in Malta

Working together for almost a year without meeting each other in person, the Skills4Sports Opening Conference that was held in Malta in December 2021 was the greatest reward for the Partners who finally managed to meet for the first time. The Opening Conference, which was organised by the Malta Football Association, was a high-profile event, well-attended, and gave the Partners the opportunity to meet, present the Project and their work, and to network with key stakeholders of the sports industry. The attendees shared their vision of the sports sector and their commitment to fighting youth unemployment. This conference was the first step towards forging a Mediterranean Alliance of stakeholders determined to increase the employability of young people by offering them skills training courses, specific to the sports industry.



The conference was attended by a total number of approximately 50 high-profile participants from six countries including stakeholders and representatives of each partner organisation.

Each organization contributed an analysis of the situation with regards to unemployment and the sports sector in their country, focusing specifically on NEETs -- i.e. young people aged 15-29 who are not in employment, education or training -- and explained the opportunities and challenges that each organisation is facing locally, in terms of implementing the project.

Event Highlights

On 6 January 2022, Palestinian project partner Salfit Development Association (SDA) invited representatives of 40 entities from the public and private sector, youth and women's centres, NGOs, sports organisations and government authorities to join the Skills4Sports Strategic Alliance. A memorandum was signed and the Alliance members committed to increasing youth employment in the sports sector. An important step in this direction will be the development of 12 training courses. On 29 March 2022, Palestinian project partner Palestine Sports for Life (PS4L) held an Infoday and also initiated the signing of an agreement by 32 representatives from governmental agencies, non-profit organizations, universities and the private sector who all committed to the Skills4Sports Strategic Alliance's goal of increasing youth employment in the sports sector. PS4L also held online campaigns highlighting the achievements and presenting the work of women in sports while also informing the public about Skills4Sports. You can read about the efforts and experiences of Palestinian professional athletes, coaches, professors and sport directors in breaking the barrier for women in sports here. The Italian project partner, **International Cooperation South** South (CISS), met with Mr. Paolo Petralia Camassa, Sports Councillor of the Municipality of Palermo, who expressed his eagerness to support the project. This meeting, as well as small-scale events and an Infoday informing young people about the project were held in February of 2022. In one these events, in which it was recognised that sports can break barriers, from the 15 NEETs who attended, some were foreigners. raising the interesting and challenging question of whether the trainings can be held in two or more languages in each project country. On 29 March 2022, the Maltese Football Association (MFA), informed more than 30 young Maltese people aged 17 to 22 about the project and offered advice on how to become more marketable in the sports sector. On 24 March 2022, the Catalan **Association Cluster of Sports** Industry (INDESCAT) held an Infoday in Barcelona, announcing that it will create 9 trainings in order to increase youth employment in the sports sector. The event was attended by more than 40 professionals from the Catalan sports sector, who had the chance to be informed about the results of the study for the project 'Skills4Sports: Increasing the Employability of NEETs by tackling the skills gap in the Catalan Sports Sector'. On World Sports Day, 6 April 2022, CISS brought together young people and eminent athletes who spoke about the challenges and the benefits of sports and presented the project. The Synthesis of the Cross-Border Analysis Report offers an in-depth discussion of youth unemployment in Mediterranean countries. According to this report:

The proportion of young people not in education, employment or training has increased since the financial crisis, and in many countries youth unemployment rates are higher than unemployment in the older working age population. Over the last years, unemployment rates in the Mediterranean – especially in the sports sector, which has been identified as a growth area with job creation potential – have risen more rapidly due to the recent economic crisis. Another critical factor that has been observed to affect the absorption of young people in the labour market, is the mismatch of skills that exist between the real skills that the labour market seeks and the skills that young job seekers are ultimately armed with. Prominent economic sectors, such as the sports industry, face challenges in finding the right skills for their growing needs when recruiting employees.
