Tasks of Initiatives Managers and Initiatives Coordinating Partners

Initiative Managers have the task of **planning** & **implementing** the activities of the Initiatives.

They will be supported by the PMT in the implementation and monitoring of the Initiatives.

Coordinating Partners shall sign sub-grants contracts (and disbursement of sub-grants) and MoU.

They will **procure Experts** for the Initiatives.

They will be supported by the PMT in sub-grant managements and procurement procedures.









Eligibility: Who can participate to the CBC Initiatives

- Micro, Small or Medium Enterprise (MSMEs), including Start-ups, and
- ❖ Business Representative Organizations (BROs), typically Associations, including also business support bodies such as Research centres, Innovation poles, that are key actors in a cluster or value chain etc., and provide services to the T/C industry and/or to the development of Circular Economy.

How to take part at CBC Initiatives (fpz)

"Simple" Participation

MSMEs/BROs interested to a Framework Initiative can apply for participation by contacting the relevant PP.

They will be selected on the basis of their consistency with the objective and activities of the Initiative.

The participation requires the signature of a Memorandum of Understanding with the Coordinating Partner to commit to the initiative.





not supposed to get any sub-grant.

Participation with "Sub-grant"

MSMEs/BROs shall apply to the Call for Sub-Grants.

They have to submit the filled Application form + 2 declarations (honour & de minimis).

The Application will be evaluated by the Initiative Committee which will decided the amount to award to the Applicant.

The selected applicant will sign a Sub-grant contract and a MoU with the Coordinating Partner/WP Leader.

Simple Participation (fpz)

A MSME/BRO can participate to ONE Framework Initiative ONLY, and to one or more (including all) Specific Initiatives being part of that Framework Initiative by signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

Suggestion: in order not to miss opportunities we suggest to involve participants to ALL the Specific Initiatives of the chosen Framework Initiative

The signature of the MoU does not imply the right to get a sub-grant.









Why promoting the "Simple Participation" (fpz)

TMA objective (result indicator) is to include **22 MSMEs/BROs** in new CBC Alliances.

The budget for subgrants (312.000) allows to benefit **31 min. - 40 max** Participants (312.000/40 = **7.800€** of average subgrant).

In order to reach 22 MSMEs/BROs willing to establish long term Alliances we should involve at least **50-60 participants**.

Please note that we have 4 Framework Initiatives and 21 Specific Initiatives, therefore there are several possibilities of involvement...









Advantages of a "Simple Participation" (fpz)

- Cooperation with eight strong organizations (project partners) for international networking, public relations and institutional marketing.
- Inclusion in an international team of peers of seven Mediterranean countries for the identification of synergies and knowledge sharing.
- Participation to innovative initiatives that may foster the adaptation of the current business model to the new business environment after Covid-19
- Support of project experts for the management and development of the Initiative in your enterprise
- Advise of external consultants procured according to the needs of the Initiatives.
- Finalization in new Alliances that may open un-explored strategic opportunities

Participation with Sub-grant (SL)

MSMEs and BROs of the T/C value chain may be awarded of a subgrant to cover-pre-defined categories of costs related to the implementation of the Framework Initiative.

The sub-grant of up to 10.000 Euro is added to the afore-mentioned advantages, however it requires to apply to a "Call for Subgrants".

Relevant documents to submit for the Call for Subgrants.

Applicants shall:

- ❖ Fill all sections of the <u>Application form</u>, including the Budget and sign it. It must be done by **computer** and in **English**.
- Fill and sign the <u>Declaration on the honour</u> and the <u>Declaration on de minimis</u>
- Send the above three files in pdf format in only one email to <u>callforsubgrants@texmedalliances.eu</u> before the deadline.









Features of Sub-Grants.

<u>Size of sub-grants</u>: Any grant request shall not exceed the maximum amount of **EUR 10.000**.

Sub-grants are not for "free use" of the beneficiary Enterprise/Organization. As said, Sub-grants are conceived as "financial contribution" to cover-predefined categories of costs related to the implementation of the Initiatives born after the signature of the sub-grant contract.

Pls note that:

- The submission of an application does not ensure the sub-grant.
- Subgrant will be awarded only to selected applicants.
- The Project reserves the right to award the <u>requested amount totally or partially.</u>

Only outputs/delivery produced after the signature of the sub-grant contract are eligible









Criteria for evaluation and selection of applications

The **Initiative Committee** (PC-TAM-FIM-FM + WP4-WP5-WP6 Leaders) will evaluate applications and select applicants according to the criteria stated in §2.4 of the Call for Subgrants:

- Whether the Applicant's type of <u>production and/or specialization are consistent</u> with the Initiative for which an application is made,
- **2. Applicant's <u>commitment</u>** to the achievement of the Framework Initiatives' objectives and contribution to the implementation of the foreseen activities.
- 3. Opportunities/Advantages the Applicant can obtain from the participation.
- 4. Capacity to assure the **sustainability** of the action, once the Project is ended.









Criteria for evaluation and selection of applications

Applications will be scored by each evaluator between 1 (poor) and 4 (excellent)

Those with a score of 3 (good) or above will be selected, up to the available budget of the call

In case the requests for sub-grants will exceed the available budget, a further selection will be done on the basis of:

- North/South balanced participation, and
- equal representation of the involved countries









Disbursement Sub-Grants (OM)

The selected MSMEs/BROs will get 50% of the awarded amount as prefinancing.

The remaining 50% one month after the validation of the completion of the outputs/deliverables.









Financial Regime: Simplified costs with standard unit costs (OM)

Under this financial regime:

- there is no obligation to keep any accounting and financial supporting documents.
- The evidence of the implementation of the activities/output become the key eligibility condition.
- The Coordinating Partners/WP Leaders shall request to sub-grantees **all proof outputs/deliverables** and report them during the Interim / Final report.
- There is no obligation of financial reporting and expenditure verification at sub-grant level: **only payment of the Coordinating partner/WP leader to the sub-grantee is considered as the eligible cost**
- the contribution of the co-financing must be done by the former, i.e. there is no co-financing by the sub-grantee.









Coordinating partners and Beneficiaries of Sub-Grants

Each Coordinating Partner will disburse subgrants to ALL selected beneficiaries of the Framework Initiative(s) of the corresponding WP regardless of the nationality of the selected Enterprise or Organization.

The criterium for disbursement of the subgrants is the WP of the Initiative <u>is not</u> the nationality of the Applicant.

Example: if a Spanish company is selected for the participation to Health Emergencies Initiative, it will be paid by mfcpole.









Additional supports for Sub-grants

The Project Management Team is making available:

- a document "Shortcut to TMA CBC Initiatives", that can help MSMEs/BROs for the application to subgrant.
- This PPT presentation and training, aiming at providing details/tips to support the PPs in assisting Applicants.









Procurement of experts for CBC Initiatives (OM)

- The Coordinating Partner and/or the Initiative manager assesses together with PC and TAM the need of External Experts and decides the Procurement procedure, with the assistance of FM and PC
- The Coordinating Partner/Initiative manager draws the Tender Dossier for selection in compliance with the chosen procedure.
- The PC/FM approve and the Coordinating Partner/WP Leader launch the procedure (a tender).
- ❖ The selected experts will be deployed at the benefit of ALL Participants of the Initiative
