
The SMC Collaborative Platform



- Monitoring and supervision of projects.






Click on the Login/Register button in the top right corner of the platform to go to the registration form. After filling the registration form you will have to confirm your email.




3. Go to the project page of your city

4. Join the active participation tasks








Participation moment # 2.1 Analysis of the current state of the building and the neighbourhood






