ENI CBC Med 2014-2020 Synthesis

- The Joint Operational Programme was adopted on 17 December 2015
- **€209 million** of EU contribution
- 14 countries involved: Algeria*, Cyprus, Egypt, France, Greece, Israel, Italy, Jordan, Lebanon, Malta, Palestine, Portugal, Tunisia, Spain
- **Principles**: Partnership, co-ownership, common benefits
- Regione Autonoma della Sardegna as Managing Authority
- 3 calls launched





^{*} Algeria adhered to the Programme but did not sign the Financing Agreement with the European Commission.










ENI CBC MEDITERRANEAN SEA BASIN PROGRAMME 2014-2020 Map of the cooperation area

- Budget: 244 Million Euro
- External cooperation programmes included in the Interreg framework 2021- 2027
- Importance of synergies with the Union for the Mediterranean, Interreg EuroMed programme, WESTMED initiative, ADRION

Interreg NEXT MED Proposed structure for calls

1st Call **Standard**

- Open to all SOs + ISO
- 45% of prog. budget
- €98.9m
- Youth strand: special focus on projects with young beneficiaries (lead/partners)
- 20% of the call budget
- €19.6m

2nd Call Green Transition

- Open to relevant SOs + ISO
- 35% of prog. budget
- €79.6m
- Aimed to achieving "green" results
- Supporting strategic objectives
- Lasting impacts

3rd Call **Capitalisation**

- Open to all SOs + ISO
- 15% of prog. Budget
- €32.9m
- New projects
- Selected results from NEXTMED projects & other initiatives
- Roll-out and of successful solutions
- Stimulate synergies with other initiatives

Follow-up & Consolidation

- Open to all SOs + ISO
- 5% of prog. Budget
- €10.9m
- ongoing or closed NEXT MED projects only
- Support successful projects to continue and improve delivery of results

Proposal for projects common elements:

Impact on the programme area

• at least 50% of funds to be spent in MPCs

Budget

- EU contribution up to 90%
- co-financing 10% at least

Partnership

- min. 3 different organizations from 3 different countries
- at least 1 organisation from MPCs
- max. 3 organisations from the same country
