Engaging the local community and stakeholders in training programs, workshops, and field activities with the Tyre Coast Nature Reserve as part of the project.

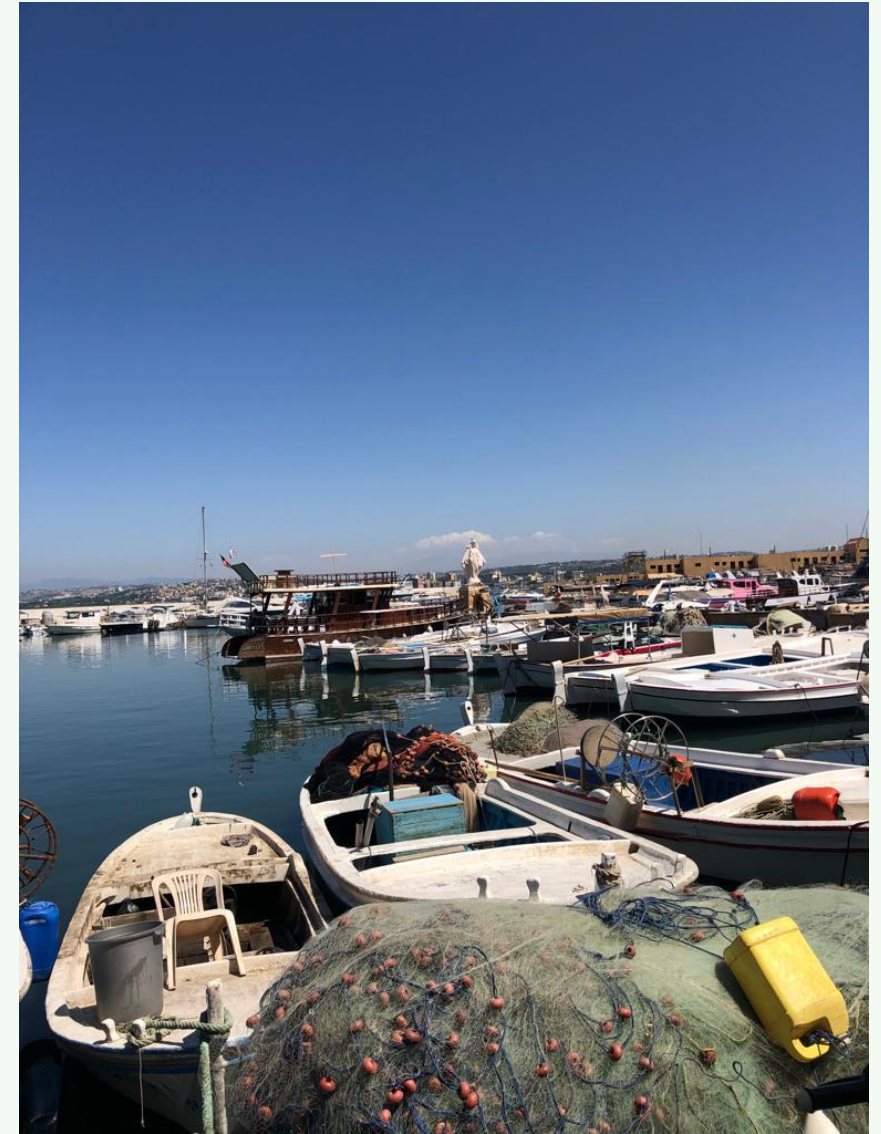


Good relationships with several official and regional institutions and carries out various programs and projects related to the coastal and marine areas.

During the visit to the Fishermen's Harbor to meet with one of the collaborating fishermen in the project, we also visited the fish market (Al Mazad) established in 2017, which has not been operational to date. If it becomes operational, it could be a significant opportunity to gather data from fishermen by weighing and recording the types of fish.





## Jordan – Aqaba Marine Reserve



The lead beneficiary signs 2 Agreement with the Aqaba Fishermen Society and Aqaba Touristic Glass Bottom Boats Society to Conduct a Citizen Science Fisheries Management Data Gathering Campaign and detailed daily data related to glass bottom boats

The third agreement was signed between the P 3 and the Aqaba Diving Association to perform the function of the Diving Data Gathering Campaign



A team from the Aqaba Marine Reserve received training in ISP, data analysis, review of system cause-effect analysis, management options/governance protocols, and EBM final report planning to ensure the sustainability of the project's output and the ongoing data collection.







## Italy: Nature Reserve of Lake Tarsia and the Mouth of the Crati River – Sibari/ Italy

**Biologists Association in cooperation with PP2, hosted the forum launched the previous year.**
