1. Summary of the document

This document outlines the implementation and the WP5 related activities, i.e. the organisation of capitalisation conferences in the framework of high-level summits in 2023. It includes a definition of the overarching aim and objectives of the related capitalization activities, outlines the target audiences, and provides a summary of the 3 capitalization conferences that took place during the lifespan of the project for enhanced mainstreaming and replication of project outcomes and recommendations to other Mediterranean policies and initiatives on integrated waste management plans.

2. Capitalisation: what is it about?

Capitalization is the process that refers to the organisation of data concerning the implementation of programmes, projects, their impacts, the methods used in order to make the accumulated experience usable for other programmes, projects or stakeholder groups. In short, the capitalization process aims to enhance, exchange and diffuse the achievements of the project.

The capitalization activities of the Med4Waste project clustered under WP5 are vital for the achievement of the overarching aim and specific objectives of the project, towards the delivery of solid results.

3. Capitalisation Conferences Objectives

WP5-Capitilisation Conferences (led by MIO-ECSDE) aimed to:

- ► Consolidate and tap into the knowledge that has been produced by relevant projects and initiatives;
- Create synergies and foster exchanges among and between stakeholders;
- Facilitate and ensure long-term access to the project's results;
- Mainstream the project results into European, Mediterranean, and national policy processes;
- ► Foster the establishment of new alliances able to address the emerging needs of the cooperation area.

4. Capitalisation Conferences Target Groups

The Med4Waste Capitalisation Conferences gathered the main Mediterranean actors related to waste management and circular economy, part of them already associated with the project as members of the 3 Med4Waste Capitalization Boards. In addition, and in line with the Quadruple Helix stakeholder approach, the following stakeholder groups have been engaged during the capitalization conferences:

- ▶ **Policy actors:** These include policy makers, decision-makers and elected officials (e.g. members of Parliament).
- ▶ **Socio-economic actors:** Local socio-economic stakeholders include associations, cooperatives, civil society organizations, non-governmental/intergovernmental organizations, foundations, and businesses.
- ▶ Scientists: These include members of the research and academic community, including those that provide science advice via established routes at local, national, regional or European level.



- Public authorities: These include public authorities at national, regional, and local levels.
- ▶ Citizens, people in society, are not a primary target group (indirect). The capitalisation activities of the project aimed however to reach educators, journalists, etc. from this group.

5. Med4Waste Capitalisation Conferences

5.1 Activity status

In the duration of the Med4Waste project, 3 capitalization conferences were organized in the framework of high-level summits, therefore exceeding the initial proposal and project's target value for the organization of 2 conferences.

Following a continuous mapping of major Mediterranean events in 2022 and 2023 and after careful consideration, the appropriate opportunities for the organisation of at least 2 capitalisation conferences were being identified and assessed. Monthly consultations with all partners during the project's TCMs were taking place so that a common decision was agreed in regards to the most promising opportunities for the successful dissemination of the project's results.

After the successful organisation of the first Med4Waste capitalisation event during the 9th Environment for Europe Ministerial Conference ("Towards a new Waste Management Governance: implementing circularity from the local to the regional level in the Mediterranean") and the project's first participation in ECOMONDO 2022, an exhibition of high visibility, the necessary ground was set for the full-blown capitalization process of the Med4Waste project in 2023. Feedback from these events as well as other awareness-raising and crossfertilization activities organised by Med4Waste has greatly guided the project's final steps and created a momentum for the project's planned Mediterranean Capitalisation Conferences by amplifying project outreach and creating a network of interested stakeholders of the region and beyond.

The following capitalization conferences have been organized by Med4Waste:

Short description of the event and type of participation	During the 9th Europe for Environment Ministerial Conference, Med4Waste hosted an insightful side-event that brought together key actors of the Mediterranean region to discuss the Mediterranean transition towards a new Waste Management Governance.
	The side event aimed at strengthening knowledge sharing and stimulating debate around themes relevant to circular economy and waste management transformation in the Mediterranean, as well as



	showcasing successful and inspiring actions to promote adaptive waste management plans, policies and other management actions. Building on existing knowledge of local, integrated, effective circular economy practices of the public, private and social sectors, the event fostered discussions on how a new waste management governance can be facilitated in the region. Through insightful discussions, the event promoted policy-oriented innovations and new governance models for integrated and efficient municipal waste management public policies across the Mediterranean and beyond.
	The expected outcomes of the event guided the next steps of the Med4Waste project on mainstreaming policy recommendations for integrated waste management plans with a more effectively engaged private sector.
	In addition, the side event facilitated the extension of the policy dialogue and capitalization activities of the project to other countries not directly involved in the project as well as look into how the outcomes of the project can be mainstreamed in the whole of the Mediterranean.

Short description of the event and type of participation	The high-attended event aimed to address the challenges and shared solutions regarding urban organic waste management and discuss the ways towards more resilient agricultural systems in the Mediterranean region. As waste management in many Mediterranean countries has
participation	multiple drawbacks that require strategic solutions and collaboration among institutions, the event was a unique opportunity to showcase the results of the ENI CBC Med and PRIMA projects on the sustainable use of organic waste which supported the event



together with the UfM which supports the development and implementation of the project within the UfM 2030 GreenerMed Agenda.

Following the 2023 International Compost Awareness Week under the specific thematic of "Healthier soil, healthier food...Compost!" the event was organised back-to-back with the 4th Meeting of the UfM Working Group on Environment and Climate Action held in Sitges, Spain, a significant meeting that takes stock of progress and updates on regional initiatives, programs, projects.

The webinar was an excellent opportunity to present some of the actions being carried out by Med4Waste itself by the different project partners, namely BETA TC, AUB, MedCities, and BusinessMed. The capitalisation approach of the project was presented, as well as ongoing the upcoming activities of the Med4Waste team such as a catalogue of practices and successful case studies on waste management for replication in other territories, the Med4ZeroWaste & Circular Economy Course and the project's mentoring programme that is already providing guidance and resources to six cities and towns in the southern Mediterranean to improve their waste management plans through tailor-made actions. The outcomes of the Business Report in the field of waste management in the Mediterranean and the relevant opportunities that arise for the Mediterranean business ecosystem were also showcased.

A session of the event was dedicated to the ENI CBC MED projects, CLIMA and DECOST which presented experiences on compost recovery and municipal waste management practices, while PRIMA projects, ISFERALDA and SUSTAINOLIVE, demonstrated the potential of compost in enriching agricultural soils in rural Mediterranean environments.

The webinar also addressed key policy areas for the region, the Sustainable Food Systems in the Mediterranean (SFS-MED) initiative Lastly, a networking session took place on how collaborations contribute to a better use of organic waste during which representatives from the abovementioned projects held interesting discussions regarding on the ground challenges faced during project implementation in different local contexts and lessons-learnt.

Overall, the significant work of Med4Waste and similar capitalisation projects was welcomed by the speakers and the audience for providing the necessary platforms to facilitate collaborations between projects, institutions and key stakeholders to share knowledge, good practices and updated research in the field from the entire Mediterranean region.
