"Decentralized management of municipal organic waste in the Mediterranean"

Cagliari (Sardinia), Italy, 24-26 October 2023

The municipal waste management field in the Mediterranean suffers from multiple drawbacks and chronic problems that require strategic solutions and collaboration among various institutions and stakeholders. To tackle the issue of organic waste more specifically, decentralized actions are increasingly being considered as a viable solution. Decentralized actions refer to local initiatives that involve communities, businesses, and individuals in managing their own organic waste. Separation at source is the major driver of the waste management system, which however is little applied in the waste sector in the region. This increases the complexity of applying a treatment methodology and diversifying treatment streams. As a result, countries are adopting different methods to cope with this rising challenge of urban waste management.

Two major regional EU-funded projects joined forces to support as smooth a transition as possible of the municipal waste sector of the Mediterranean region to a sustainable circular model. The 3-days event will therefore bring together policy makers (ministry officials), local authorities, the private sector, NGOs, researchers and other stakeholders, to strengthen capacities and skills for informed decision-making related to decentralized waste management in the region. Sardinia was chosen as a host region that has a lot to show for itself in terms of its progress on this topic in the last years. The event will combine working sessions and study visits, including the presentation of the Med4Waste key findings, innovative practices and models applicable in various municipalities, and it will strengthen the regional dialogue and cooperation on sustainable waste management.

It constitutes one of the many regional capacity building activities of the WES project as well as the Final Capitalisation Event of the Med4Waste project.

WES IN A NUTSHELL

The <u>"Water and Environment Support (WES) in the ENI Neighbourhood South Region</u>" project is a regional technical support project funded by the European Neighbourhood Instrument (ENI South). WES aims to protect the natural resources in the Mediterranean context and to improve the management of scarce water resources in the region. WES mainly aims to solve the problems linked to pollution prevention and the rational use of water. It builds on previous similar regional projects funded by the European Union (Horizon 2020 CB/MEP, SWIM I and II, SWIM-Horizon 2020 SM) and strives to create a supportive environment and increase the capacity of all stakeholders in the WES Partner Countries (Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Libya, Palestine, Syria and Tunisia).

MED4WASTE IN A NUTSHELL

<u>Med4Waste</u> is a 2-year-long capitalisation project funded by the ENI CBC Med programme on the priority of waste management. The objective of the Med4Waste project is to facilitate new governance models for integrated and efficient urban waste management policies across the Mediterranean region, with particular emphasis on organic waste and circular economy through adapting waste management plans, policies and other management actions and regulatory drivers. Med4Waste focuses on the identification of successful and efficient waste management

practices developed by 5 other ENI CBC Med projects, and their dissemination and mainstreaming into public polices and plans carried out by the relevant public or private stakeholders.

The Sardinia region is an Italian island with typical Mediterranean food habits and weather conditions, very similar to those of the MENA countries. It is also an important tourist destination. In 2000, Sardinia was Italy's worst performing region in waste management with a separate collection rate of 3.8%. Since then, the situation radically changed, thanks to the decision of setting up a Regional Programme for organic waste within its Waste Management Plan in 2004. Ten years later, Sardinia was the best performing island in the Mediterranean and at the forefront of Italian and European regions with separate collection rate reaching 60% and waste generation per capita decreasing consistently (moving from 520 kg to 443 kg and residual waste moving from 500 kg to 176 kg per inhabitant). Nowadays, its waste management performances are still improving.
